3. Take either the ACT or the SAT at least twice.

 - test on September 14, register by August 16
 - test on October 26, register by September 20
 - test on December 14, register by November 8
 - test on February 8, register by January 10
 - test on April 4, register by February 28
 - test on June 13, register by May 8
 - test on July 18, register by June 19
 - SAT dates and registration [deadlines](#)
 - test on August 24, register by July 26
 - test on October 5, register by September 6
 - test on November 2, register by October 3
 - test on December 7, register by November 8
 - test on March 14, register by February 14
 - test on May 2, register by April 3
 - test on June 6, register by May 8
4. Attend a career trip, possibly shadowing a potential occupation.
5. Attend on-campus visits from various college representatives.
